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I. DESCRIPTION

Undergraduate Special Projects in Music will give the student an opportunity to experience a **musical collaboration** with others as they apply their skills, knowledge, and talent in an **outside approved group or ensemble**. Each student will plan and complete their own project with **instructor approval**. Credit hours may vary depending on the approved project. (Individual students need the permission of the **Music Department chair to register for the course.**)

II. OBJECTIVES

- A. Participation in a local music group or ensemble when the student cannot participate in Calvary University in-campus music ensemble courses.

III. REQUIREMENTS

1. The student must have 2 online meetings with a professor to discuss the project in the beginning and evaluate at the end.
2. The student must provide clear plans of their chosen project and demonstrate the skills and knowledge used in an audio or visual recording.
3. The assigned professor will determine the amount of work that the student needs to complete for appropriate credit hours.
4. The student needs to document a weekly journal.

 - b. 2 letters (evaluation) from the director 20%Total=100%

VI. OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The Bible is a required textbook in every course at Calvary University. To facilitate academic level study, students are required to use for assignments and research an English translation or version of the Bible based on formal equivalence (*meaning that the translation is generally word-for-word from the original languages*), including any of the following: New American Standard (NASB, English Standard Version (ESV), New King James (NKJV), or King James (KJV). Other translations and versions based on dynamic equivalence (*paraphrases and thought-for-thought translations like NLT and NIV*) may be used as supplemental sources. Please ask the professor if you have questions about a particular translation or version.
