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I. DESCRIPTION

III. REQUIREMENTS

- A. Be accepted into the Calvary music team through audition by the director.
- B. Attend all regular and extra rehearsals of the music team for the entire semester regardless of whether the student is taking the course for credit or audit.
- C. Commit to being in Calvary music team the entire semester.
- D. Endeavor to perform, testify, and live in such a way that positively reflects what Christ has done in your life as an individual.
- E. Be an effective, positive ambassador of Calvary University in word, deed, music, and every aspect of life.
- F. The student in the Calvary music team is allowed up to 1 cut from rehearsals before the student's grade is lowered. The student is strongly urged to not cut any rehearsals unless there is serious illness, sports team trips, or a serious family emergency. This applies to students taking Calvary music team for credit or audit.
- G. Grading. The Calvary music team member will be graded on the following criteria:

Performance readiness, attendance & punctuality
Learning and mastery of the music

IV. METHODS

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- A. In-class methods will include full-group and sectional rehearing, instructions, and information.
- B. Out-of-class methods will include the student practicing and memorizing the text and music of all pieces to be performed. Personal practice is strongly encouraged and is vital to the total group presentation.

V. MATERIALS

- A. All music for the Calvary music team will be provided by the Music Department. Music is to be treated with respect and care. The music is to be returned to the Music Department at the end of the school year so that it may be used again in the future.
