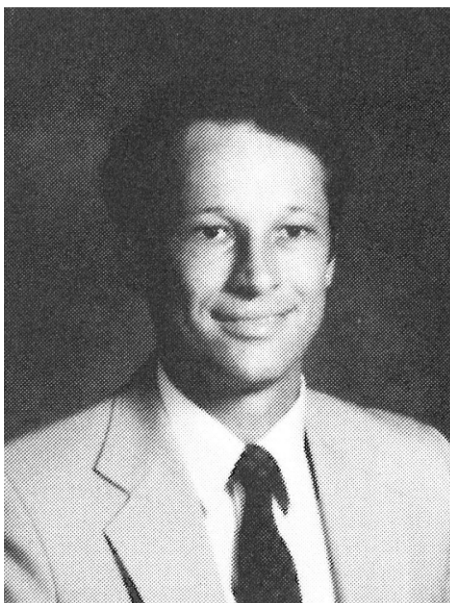
was worshiping together outside of the church walls. The evening ended in the gym for Warrior Madness with a dunking contest and scrimmages.

This Masterworks performance will also feature a selection of Christmas music and all—students, alumni, and other members of the community—are invited to come and enjoy this beautiful winter production. Throughout the semester, three graduates from the music department presented recitals. Eric Norman, Ashley Maxwell, and Chris Stolberg each welcomed audiences to share the fruit of their dedication and hard work.

The athletic teams have experienced exciting successes and learned through challenges this fall. The women's volleyball team has been ranked as high as #6 in the country, placing third in the Midwest Christian College Conference tournament, and competing in the

NCCAA Regional Tournament. The Lord has blessed Calvary with a talented and supportive team. The men's soccer team is a young one, and is going through a rebuilding season. Their theme is from Psalm 34:8: "Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in Him". The team's young group of core players are seeing substantial playing time and will improve greatly in the future. The women's basketball team has been on the move from the day the players arrived on campus; they have even been inviting outside students to early morning workouts, and on some mornings, numbers have grown to twenty-five students! The men's basketball team is an older team with nine returning players

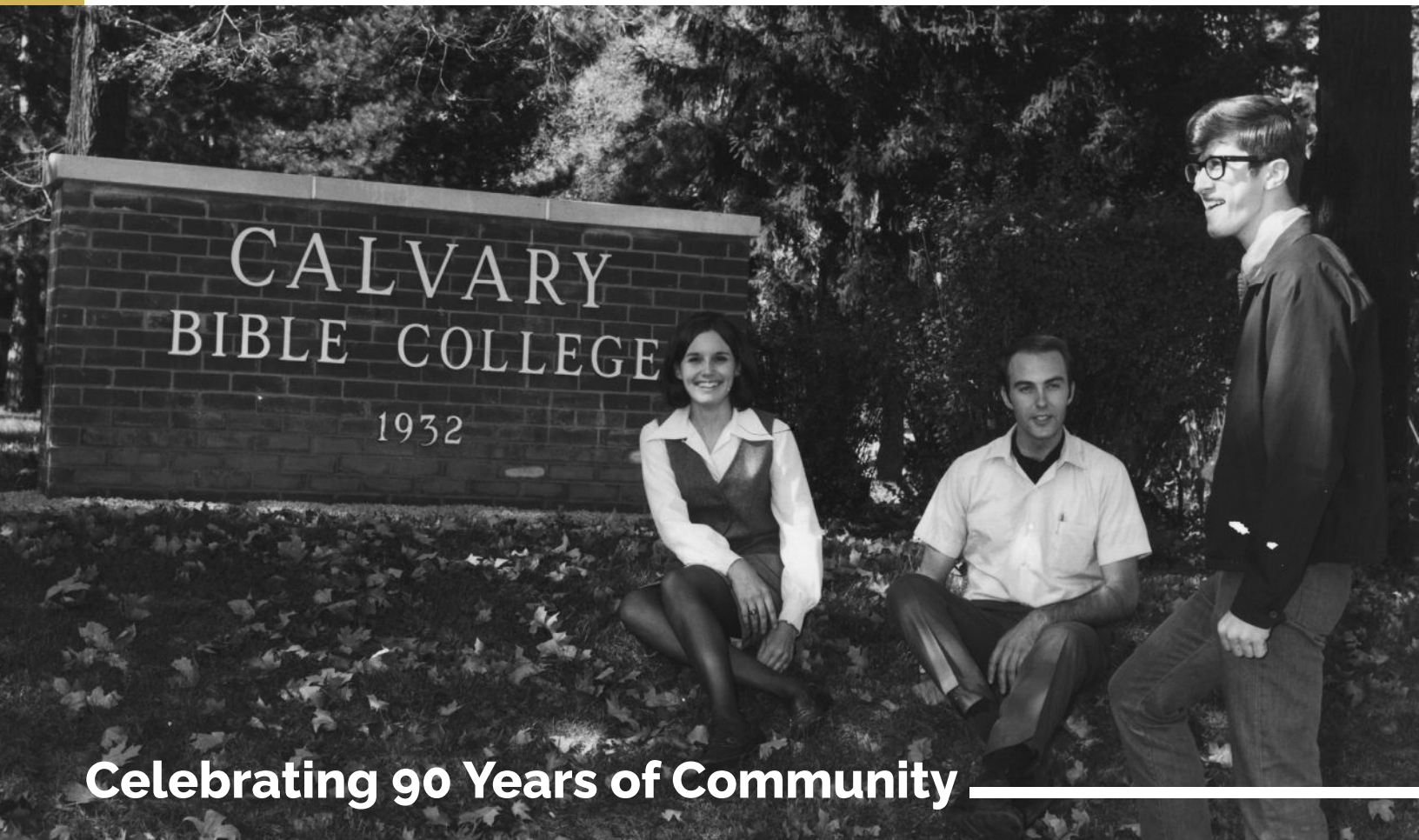

Celebrating 90 Years of Community

Every now and again, it's good to look back and reflect on our past and where we came from. To remember where we started and to consider how far we have come. Our story begins in darkness and despair, in a nation gripped by the Great Depression where there was little hope for the future. Yet, in the midst of such uncertainty, several men of God joined together in a vision to create a school. A school that would be a beacon of light in the heartland. They called it the Kansas City Bible Institute.

We had humble beginnings. Legend has it that the institute began with only \$2.00 provided by Dr. Wilson and Reverend Johnson. In truth, though, many people of God came together to support the vision in many ways. Some gave their prayers, others gave their money,

and still others gave their time. The Ladies Committee were absolute warriors in the cause: they sewed, painted, and ran down enough donations (of things like 500 lbs. of flour) that the kitchen was stocked and ready to go when the school opened. These people were not content to just start the school and then move on to another ministry, they stayed firm, continuing to support the institute even as it changed, expanded, and relocated. First, we changed presidents, then we merged with Midwest Bible College and became Calvary Bible College, then we changed locations. The people of God stayed firm because they knew that the outer trappings weren't what mattered, what mattered was that the mission stayed the same: preparing people to serve from the biblical worldview.

In fact, our transformation had only just begun. In 1987 we merged with Citadel Bible College and added on the Calvary Theological Seminary because we knew that four years of education in the Word simply wasn't enough for everyone, some people wanted more. We rose to the challenge. Then in 2016 we decided to go even further and rebranded as Calvary University so that we could offer more programs and prepare the people of God to go out and minister

to the world in even more vocations and ministries. We wanted more of our students to go out into the world as godly men and women who shine the light of Christ in dark places because the mission is the same. We exist because of Him, through Him, and for Him. "For from Him and through Him and to Him are all things. To Him be the glory forever. Amen" (Romans 11:36 NAS).

The name of the institution, campus location, president, faculty, and staff may change but what endures is that Calvary University is standing firm, because it is built on the Bible. Every class and every program is committed to excellence and prepares men and women to live and serve in the church and in the world according to the biblical worldview. We have always been committed to providing affordable education. To this day we offer marketable credentials so that our graduates are not only prepared for excellence in life and service, but they are also positioned for it. Calvary is carefully designed to provide not just a place for learning, but a place for growth. Our faculty don't simply teach, they are committed to discipleship. Our students don't just study, they gain real world experience through our Practical Christian Ministries Program. We don't send our students forth blind; we send them out with pragmatic experience of how to live out their faith no matter where God sends them. These are not just words to us; we have a proven track record of over 9,300 alumni who continue to live out the Great Commission and carry God's light into all parts of the world. Some of our alumni have even given the ultimate sacrifice in service to that mission. We remember them.



Martin Burnham's commitment to the ministry of reconciliation led him to live, serve, and give up his life for the lost. Martin's testimony and that of our other alumni are what inspire us to continue in our mission.

To enter Madison Hall, our main administration building, you must walk past a memorial that honors alumnus Martin Burnham. It is a solemn and encouraging reminder of why Calvary University exists. A Calvary University education is a biblical passport for Christian servants to put them on their path to effectively fulfill the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) and the Great Commandment (Matthew 22:36-40). Our alumni have been provided a biblical compass for life and are empowered by faith to work and make a lasting contribution for the cause of Christ (James 2:14-18). Martin's commitment to the ministry of reconciliation (2 Corinthians 5:11-21) led him to live, serve, and give up his life for the lost. Martin's testimony and that of our other alumni are what inspire us to continue in our mission.

From the humble beginning of two men and \$2.00 the Lord has grown Calvary to be an institution with hundreds of faculty, staff,

and students, thousands of alumni and steward investors, and a multimillion-dollar operating budget. For 90 years, God has utilized Calvary University to send men and women out into His service and we have every confidence that He will empower us for 90 more! To God be the Glory! ■

Matt Brewer graduated from Calvary Bible College with a Bachelor of Science in Secondary Education in Bible and Mathematics, and received a Master of Science in Educational Administration from Clark Summit University. Although his career path began in education, Matt is currently working at Equity Bank. “God’s plan for my life is to walk in obedience and fellowship with Him each day. For me, success is found in the stewardship of where God has placed me.”

Matt’s first professional job was as a mathematics instructor and coach at Blue Ridge Christian School

(1986-1991), where he learned the important lessons of setting an example in his work, family, and spiritual life. After working as a supervisor for his father’s construction company, Matt delved deeper into business at Tomkins Industries (1993-2000), where Matt became a proactive leader.

Matt then returned to work at Kansas City Christian School (2000-2005) as the high school principal, applying his abilities to financial responsibilities as well as putting to use his relational competency and passion for coaching.
